This sixteenth annual festival of music and liturgy marks the start of the summer season in the world of church music here in the South. We welcome many hundreds of music lovers over these three glorious days.

Often this festival has had a specific theme celebrating an anniversary of a significant composer. This year the festival is purely a celebration of the importance of music in our worship.

William Boyce has his tercentenary in 2011, and this will be marked in the Sunday evening choral and orchestral concert. The concert will also include a performance of the **Mozart Clarinet Concerto** with **Walter Brewster** as soloist and the perennial favourites: Vivaldi Gloria and Handel Zadok the Priest. Again, the Durlston Court School Choir will join St Stephen's Choir for this concert.

The composer of our festival commission this year is **Malcolm Archer**.

The Revd Stephen Shipley will be giving the lecture. He produces many of the religious programmes on BBC radio including choral evensong and the Sunday morning service.

Our special guests this year include **Andrew Lumsden** of Winchester Cathedral giving the Whitlock Recital and **Dr Francis Jackson** who will be playing on Monday evening.

Our visiting choirs are **Portsmouth Cathedral Choir** and **Christchurch Priory Choir**.
