COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: hear our prayer which we offer for all your faithful people, that in their vocation and ministry they may serve you in holiness and truth to the glory of your name; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen

Genesis 18.1–10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, 'My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.' And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.' Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, 'Where is your wife, Sarah?' And he said, 'There, in the tent.' Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.' And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him.

Colossians 1.15–28

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place

in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him—provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh, I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

Luke 10.38–42

Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me.' But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.'

Dear Friends,

Getting the balance right (in anything) is never easy, but we've got to try.

People often like to present Jesus as the model for Christian action, by showing that he was so uncompromisingly available to everyone. They fail to realise that he was only able to be open and available in that way, because he was first open and available, attentively, to God. It was only because he had exposed himself without restraint to God's love that he was able to be filled with the fullness that he could communicate to others. Without the 'hidden years' (before he was aged 30), the time in the desert, the upper room or the loneliness of the garden of Gethsemane, there would be no compassion for the needy, no love for the loveless, no healing for the sick, no death for us all.

To follow him, doesn't mean that we should try to imitate or copy him as an artist copies a model. It does not mean that we should merely imitate the outward manifestation of the inner light that burned in him. Rather, it means that we must regularly expose ourselves to that self-same light so that it might set us afire too.

There is ultimately only one source of energy to revitalise each of us, everywhere. It is when the dynamic rays of God's inexhaustible love begin to permeate the very chance of growing than a drooping geranium in a dark room.

Once we see clearly that life in all its fullness begins with God, everything else begins to slot into place. That is what we are asked to affirm in baptism and confirmation, and that it what is further affirmed in ordination. We are delighted to have with us for a month a student training for ordination. Scott Canadas writes to introduce himself to us as follows:

"Hello, I am Scott, I have completed my first year of 3 of Ordination training at the College of the Resurrection, Mirfield. I am living in community at the college full-time. It is an amazing opportunity to be completing my formation training alongside the fellow students and the monastic community. I am enjoying my studies and the rhythm of daily prayer here. My home Parish is St Symphorian's Durrington-on-Sea. Before the process started, I was completing my BA Hons in Applied Theology Specialising in Missional Leadership Studies at Moorlands Bible College. After Moorlands I became a Leadership Assistant at Swaythling Parish Southampton as part of the CEMES Scheme. I am delighted at the opportunity to be on placement with Bournemouth Parish and am looking forward to learning and being involved in the church ministry there.

My Vocation to the Priesthood.

I had my calling to be a Priest when I went on a pilgrimage to the Shrine of our Lady of Walsingham. It was a turning point in my life and a moment I will never forget. I was with my family in a service, and Bishop Lindsay was celebrating the Eucharist. Normally in the service when the celebrant says, "May the Lord be with you", I would respond and nothing would happen. But this time, he said, 'May the Lord be with you' and I felt a rush of power hit me. I feel that the Lord filled me with his Holy Spirit and I saw myself where the Bishop was standing. From that moment I knew in my heart that God was calling me to be a Priest. It was intensely moving and I cried. It was an incredible experience and I have, since then, had a sense of calling and vocation that God has called me to serve. From that moment on I have been following the call God has on my life to serve others. The passion I have for serving others is very strong. My calling has affected my life so much that I have not deviated from it from the initial calling I had a Walsingham when I was 11. I have always been focused on my calling to the Priesthood all the days of my life leading up to the present day."

A prayer adapted from one written by St Ambrose:

***This day – everyday –
Let my door stand open to receive Christ,
Unlock my soul to him,
Offer him a welcome in my mind
And then see the riches of simplicity,
The treasures of peace,
And the joy of grace. Amen.***
