# **MAY MUSIC FESTIVAL 2019**

This is the twenty-fourth annual celebration of music within the context of worship to be held here at St Stephen's.

Our special guests this year include **Carlton Etherington**, Organist and Director of Music of Tewkesbury Abbey, who will be giving the Whitlock organ recital.

We welcome **James Lancelot**, who recently retired as Organist and Master of the Choristers of Durham Cathedral and will be giving the lecture.

We welcome back **Chichester Cathedral Choir** directed by **Charles Harrison** who will be singing the Saturday Festival Evensong.

The festival opens on the Friday with an evening of music and dancing played by the **Red Fez Orchestra**.

On Monday the choir of **St Paul's Covent Garden** directed by **Nick Gallagher** will be singing Choral Evensong.

**St Stephen's Choir** will be joined by our neighbours **Richmond Hill St Andrew's URC Choir** for the Saturday Mass, and this year our Festival Organist is **Sean Tucker**.

On Sunday morning the St Stephen's Choir, festival singers with soloists and chamber orchestra will be singing liturgically the **"Spaur" Mass by Mozart**.

On Sunday evening we are delighted to welcome **Durlston Court School Choir** who will be joining the festival singers, directed by **Rob Dishington** in a programme of orchestral and choral music to include the **Magnificat** by Pergolesi. On Monday the lunchtime recital is given by the **Whitchurch Ensemble** playing trios by Beethoven and Glinka.

The final event on Monday evening will include the **Gloria** by Vivaldi sung by female voices and accompanied by strings and organ.
